Description: There are seventy-four (74) Ardisia recorded species in the Philippines, sixty-two (62) of which are endemic. Aunasin is a small evergreen tree that grows up to 12m tall with small, white to pale purple five-petaled flowers. This shade-loving tree grows well at low to medium altitude and is usually planted as hedge or border plant. Its fruits, leaves, and flowers are edible.
