



**Common Name:** Bagawak Morado

**Scientific Name:** *Clerodendrum quadriloculare* (Blanco) Merr.

**Family:** *Lamiaceae*

**DAO/IUCN category:** Least Concern (IUCN 3.1), Vulnerable



**Description:** Bagawak, a large shrub to small tree up to 5 meters high, is known for leaves with dark purple lower surface. It produces tubular flowers borne on terminal inflorescence, each flower has 5 white petals with a pink tube. In some places, it is considered a highly invasive perennial shrub since it produces large amounts of viable seeds dispersed by birds and other animals. Its leaves are applied topically for wound healing and ulcers
