## **Description:**

Most ficus species in the Philippines are called 'balete' and often perceived as enchanted or bewitched trees. The Benjamin Fig or balete is a broadleaf evergreen tree that may reach a height of 15m tall or more. As a low maintenance plant that can tolerate partial shade, baletes are very popular houseplants. This bird-attracting tree with small globular red or reddish orange fruits is also used for container planting, bonsai, roadsides and as a shade providing tree.
